

The Department of Pathology is seeking an AP/CP or CP trained (board certified or board eligible) pathologist to join the Division of Clinical Pathology as a medical director of the University of Utah Hospital Laboratories. The successful candidate will share responsibility with two other medical directors for supporting inpatient laboratory operations at the University Hospital and the Huntsman Cancer Institute, as well as outpatient laboratory operations. The scope of laboratory testing at these facilities includes routine chemistry and toxicology, hematology, urinalysis and coagulation assays, as well as point-of-care testing. The successful candidate will be expected to support laboratory and hospital quality improvement, compliance, and accreditation initiatives, and to provide consultation to clinicians. Participation in teaching of medical students, pathology residents, and clinical chemistry fellows is also expected. Research in the area of applied laboratory medicine is encouraged. Academic rank and salary will be commensurate with experience.
