The Clinical Laboratories have a track record of excellence and innovation spanning the breadth of pathology and laboratory medicine including anatomic pathology and its various subspecialties, hematology, chemistry, blood bank/transfusion medicine, microbiology, immunology, coagulation, transplant immunology and genomic & molecular pathology. In addition to providing leadership for the Clinical Laboratories, the successful applicant must be committed to education of medical students and to the department's highly competitive residency training and fellowship programs. Applicants must have an academic background, preferably including current or past scholarly productivity in translational or clinical research as well as prior experience managing a clinical laboratory or laboratory section. Candidates must possess an MD or MD/PhD, be board-certified in Anatomic and Clinical Pathology or Clinical Pathology by the American Board of Pathology, hold or be able to obtain an Illinois medical license by start of employment, and qualify for a faculty appointment at the rank of Professor or Associate Professor.
