

Academic Position in Clinical Chemistry University of Minnesota

The Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathology at the University of Minnesota seeks a full-time clinical chemist. MD or PhD, with clinical pathology residency training or clinical chemistry post-doctoral training and board certification or eligibility is required. Physician applicants must be eligible for medical licensure in Minnesota. Academic rank, compensation and appointment type will be based on qualifications and experience. Candidates must have demonstrated ability in teaching and in scholarly productivity. The clinical chemistry section provides all clinical chemistry testing for University of Minnesota Health which includes the main teaching hospital at the University of Minnesota, and specialized testing for Fairview Health System's other hospitals and clinics in Minnesota.

Responsibilities will include on service time in clinical chemistry including the oversight of new test development, validation, implementation, teaching residents, fellows, medical students, and graduate students, and the pursuit of collaborative and independent research and other scholarly activities. The ideal candidate will serve as the Associate Medical Director of the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital's pediatric acute care laboratory. Preferred candidates will be active in their national organizations and have experience in fostering an academic environment for medical students, residents and faculty. There will be protected time to develop an investigational career, with a goal of developing collaborative and independent research. An interest in pediatric clinical chemistry or informatics is desired but not required.

The University of Minnesota is a large and diverse university and medical school with a large subspecialty practice plan of over 900 physicians, University of Minnesota Physicians. The Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathology is home to a large number of anatomic and clinical pathology faculty as well as many basic science faculty involved in research, undergraduate and graduate education.
