



## Assistant or Associate Director of Clinical Microbiology

The Department of Pathology of UHCMC/CWRU in Cleveland, Ohio, seeks an academic clinical microbiologist to serve as Assistant or Associate Director of Clinical Microbiology. The Assistant/Associate Director will share clinical oversight of a state of the art clinical microbiology lab, which is an early adopter of bacteriology total laboratory automation. The laboratory provides bacteriology, mycobacteriology, mycology, virology, parasitology, and molecular microbiology services to numerous outpatient facilities and more than a dozen acute care hospitals in the UH network including UHCMC, Seidman Cancer Center, MacDonald Women's Hospital, and Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital. The lab is centrally located at UHCMC, which fosters daily collaborative interaction with adult and pediatric infectious disease teams. The successful candidate will be expected to engage in clinical result interpretation, provide diagnostic expertise to healthcare providers and laboratory colleagues, be actively involved in medical student, resident and fellow training, demonstrate an aptitude for constructive engagement with clinical colleagues and laboratory staff to ensure high quality clinical care, and participate in clinical or basic research programs. Opportunities for engagement in other pathology services will be available if of interest to the candidate. A variety of opportunities for scholarly research are in place as the UHCMC clinical microbiology lab has a long history of engaging in translational research projects, and the CWRU Department of Pathology is in the top 10 nationally in NIH funding. Involvement in clinical, translational, or basic research will be encouraged and supported.

Candidates must hold an MD, PhD, or MD-PhD degree. MD and MD-PhD candidates must be board-certified/eligible with fellowship training and/or specialty expertise in medical microbiology and must be qualified for an unrestricted medical license in Ohio. PhD candidates will have completed a CPEP-approved fellowship and be ABMM board-certified/eligible. A record of scholarly contributions in clinical, translational, or basic research is preferred.

Academic rank and salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
